Rufus Isaacs, Small Fruit Entomologist at Michigan State University will be a presenter at the St. Croix & Peninsular Field Days. Rufus was a co-author of the Pocket Guide for Grape IPM Scouting in the North Central and Eastern United States and works closely with Michigan's grape industry to develop and implement IPM for insect pests.

Tim Martinson, Coordinator Cornell Cooperative Extension, Cornell University will be a presenter at the Viroqua Field Day. Tim provides coordination of all viticulture extension programs throughout New York state. He will share his expertise on sustainable grape production, focusing on weed management in grape IPM.

Dan Mahr, UW-Extension Fruit Entomologist, will share his expertise on beneficial natural enemies found in and around the vineyard. Dan has implemented IPM in a number of fruit crops throughout Wisconsin. Now in grapes, Dan will explain how to identify and conserve these beneficial natural enemies.

Steve Jordan & Patty McManus, UW-Madison, Department of Plant Pathology will share their expertise on grape diseases. Steve will share his extensive knowledge on Eutypa dieback—a grape cane disease that is often overlooked. Steve is a welcome addition to Wisconsin and comes from Michigan State University.
